Involving 30 participating scholars from 17 countries, this study was conducted from 2008 to 2011; it involved several stages in an innovative sequence. Rather than beginning with interviews with news industry professionals who make the decisions about foreign content, the study instead began with analysis of the content itself and then proceeded to analysis of audiences (via opinion surveys). Finally, the gatekeeping journalists were interviewed with regard to the empirical findings — whether they could have guessed at audience perceptions, for example. Cohen (emeritus, communication, Tel Aviv U., Israel; and communications research, Yezreel Valley College, Israel) provides clear prefatory and introductory information. With reference to sociological and linguistic concepts, she looks at how audiences are understood as well as methods and strategies in radio news, and changes that have occurred over the last 40 years. The literature on C.S. Lewis is vast, but the prefatory comments by a scholar in the field, Matthew Dickerson (Middlebury College), identify this work as a distinctive contribution. Hilder (English, Trinity Western U.) specializes in children's and fantasy literature. Her study sidesteps conventional notions of Lewis's attitudes toward women and finds instead a layered complexity, which she clearly explicates. (Annotation ©2013 Book News Inc. Portland, OR)

In an anthology based on a seminar held at Arizona State U. in 2010, campus scholars introduce the seminal idea treated by de Beauvoir in The Second Sex (1949) that becoming a woman is a social construction. International contributors from the humanities, social sciences, history, cultural studies and gender studies critically reflect on the construction of sexualities in the context of girls' use, representation and self-representation in historical and contemporary media, and media literacy projects to battle sexism and sexualization. For example, one author questions the HPV vaccine marketing campaign's self-empowerment motive. (Annotation ©2013 Book News Inc. Portland, OR)

There has been much study of the English that speakers of different first languages use when English is their preferred or necessary medium of communication, says Poppi (English language and translation, U. of Modena, Italy), but little attention has been paid to written English as a lingua franca (ELF). She shows how it is adopted and adapted by users from different lingua-cultural background when they communicate in the written mode. Her topics include the news discourse and ELF membership in The Hindustani Times, and The Baltic Times, communicating in business contexts, the language of corporate websites, politeness strategies and cultural differences in email communications, and internal corporate emails in a company that operates internationally.
